

CONGRESS ENROLLED ACT No. 1001

AN ACT concerning student government administration and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the students of Indiana University in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act shall be known as the “Fiscal Year 2023 IUSG Budget Act”.

SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]

(a) The following definitions apply throughout this Act:

(1) “Fall” means the fiscal period beginning September 1, 2022, and ending December 31, 2022.

(2) “Spring” means the fiscal period beginning January 1, 2023, and ending May 31, 2023.

(3) “Summer” means the fiscal period beginning June 1, 2022, and ending August 31, 2022.

(b) All money appropriated by this Act is subject to expenditure for such purposes, at such time, and in such manner as may be provided for in this Act, in the IUSG Bylaws, or in other statutes.

(c) All money appropriated by this Act is subject to such purchasing practices as the University may mandate for the IUSG financial account or accounts from which the money is appropriated.

SECTION 3. [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]

For the conduct of student government, its branches, offices, funds, departments, services, initiatives, and undertakings, the following sums in SECTIONS 4 through 5 are appropriated for the designated periods of time from the student fee fund of Indiana University Student Government or other specifically designated funds.

For each fiscal period, the appropriation is effective at the beginning of the fiscal period. Unless otherwise specified, any amounts remaining unexpended from summer or fall appropriations at the end of those fiscal periods shall roll over and remain available for expense or encumbrance until the close of the fiscal year ending May 31, 2023.

In this Act, unless otherwise specified, the appropriation is from the student fee fund.

SECTION 4. [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]

The above appropriations for room reservations are for official meetings of congress at locations on campus.

The above appropriations for the office of the recorder are for congressional record-keeping materials including but not limited to binders, binder dividers, paper, and printing costs.

CONGRESSIONAL STIPENDS

Total Expense	\$0	\$3,330	\$3,330
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For each of the fall and spring legislative sessions, officers and standing committee chairs are entitled to the following sums of money from the above appropriations: speaker, \$800; parliamentarian, \$240; recorder, \$400; press secretary, \$240; diversity, equity, and inclusion committee chair, \$200; education committee chair, \$200; environmental affairs committee chair, \$200; finance committee chair, \$200; oversight and reform committee chair, \$200; student life committee chair, \$200; title IX committee chair, \$200.

If congress eliminates an officer or committee referenced in the above paragraph and replaces the committee or officer with a new standing committee or position, the new officer or the chair of the new standing committee is entitled to the stipends of the eliminated officer or committee chair. If congress creates a new, additional standing committee or officer, money from the above appropriations shall be used to pay stipends to the new officer or the chair of the new committee in amounts determined by the speaker of the congress. However, the amount paid to a new officer or chair shall not exceed the amount allotted above for the chairs for that session. If congress assigns substantial additional duties to an existing officer, the speaker may increase the stipends paid to that officer, but said stipends shall not be more than \$100 greater than the amount allotted above for that officer for that session.

Whenever a position is entitled to a stipend from the above appropriations, the stipend is for the person who holds that position as of the date occurring thirty (30) days after the first day of the session for which the stipend is allotted.

A person who simultaneously holds more than one (1) position entitled to a legislative stipend under this act shall be paid the stipend whose dollar value is greater and shall not be paid the other stipend.

B. JUDICIAL

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JUDICIAL STIPENDS

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For each of the fall and spring fiscal periods, the chief justice is entitled to a stipend of \$600 from the above appropriations.

For each of the fall and spring fiscal periods, each associate justice who accepts their stipend pursuant to R.B. § 6-2-6(d) is entitled to the sum of money from the above appropriations found by the quotient of:

two thousand six hundred dollars (\$2,600.00); divided by

the number of associate justices who accept their stipend for that fiscal period pursuant to R.B. § 6-2-6(d).

However, each associate justice is entitled to a stipend of no greater than four hundred fifty dollars (\$450.00) for any single fiscal period.

C. EXECUTIVE

FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL OPERATIONS

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The above appropriation for the first-year internship program includes money for purposes including, but not limited to, team-building exercises and an end-of-semester celebration.

EXECUTIVE STIPENDS

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For each of the fall and spring fiscal periods, executive officers are entitled to the following sums of money from the above appropriations for executive stipends: student body president, \$1,200; student body vice president, \$960; treasurer, \$800; congressional secretary, \$800; chief of staff, \$900; chief technology officer, \$600; director of communications and engagement, \$800; director of diversity, equity, and inclusion, \$400;

director of student life, \$400; director of environmental affairs, \$400; director of sexual violence prevention, \$400; member of the board of finance (not including the treasurer), \$125 each.

If congress eliminates a position referenced in the above paragraph and replaces it with a new position, the new officer is entitled to the stipends of the eliminated officer. If a new, additional senior executive position is created by congress, money from the above appropriations for executive stipends shall be used to pay stipends to the new officer in amounts determined by the president. However, the amount paid to a new officer shall not exceed the amount allotted above for the director of environmental affairs for that fiscal period.

Whenever a position is entitled to a stipend from the above appropriations, the stipend is for the person who holds that position as of the date occurring thirty (30) days after the first day of the fiscal period for which the stipend is allotted. In a case in which statute allows for two (2) directors of the same department simultaneously, if there are two (2) directors on the date specified in this paragraph, then the stipend allotted for that position shall be divided equally between those two (2) persons.

ANNUAL EVENTS

The above appropriations for ABTS conferences are for IUSG attendance at the summer conference, the winter conference, and the Big Ten on the Hill event of the Association of Big Ten Students. This money is for the cost of attendance, including registration, travel, lodging, and a per diem allowance of \$50 per student for meals, for the following attendees: the student body president, the student body vice president, the association of big ten students liaison, not more than four (4) members of congress designated by the speaker of the congress, and not more than two (2) additional students designated by the president.

The above appropriations for inaugural ceremonies are for one or more events in April 2023 to celebrate the inauguration of the president and vice president elected at the 2023 spring general election, including but not limited to banquets and associated costs. However, none of this money may be used for an event in the Indiana Memorial Union.

DINNERS WITH STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

Fall-Semester Dinner	\$2,500	\$0	\$0
Spring-Semester Dinner	\$0	\$0	\$2,500

Each of the two (2) lines of appropriation above is for one (1) dinner event hosted by IUSG during the semester stated in the name of the line of appropriation. For each such dinner, the money is for purposes such as room reservations and catering for attendance consisting of IUSG officeholders and representatives of registered student organizations.

*Summer**Fall**Spring*

The purpose of these dinners must be to foster dialogue and collaboration between IUSG and other student organizations. No later than September 9, 2022, the chief of staff shall submit in writing to congress and the president a finalized guest list for the fall-semester dinner.

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For each of the fall and spring fiscal periods, each co-chair of the election commission is entitled to a stipend of \$200 from the above appropriations for election commission stipends, and each election commissioner who is not a co-chair is entitled to a stipend of \$100.

Whenever a position is entitled to a stipend from the above appropriations, the stipend is for the person who holds that position as of the date occurring thirty (30) days after the first day of the fiscal period for which the stipend is allotted.

SECTION 5. [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

FOR THE BOARD OF FINANCE

Transfers for Student-Facing Activities	\$10,000	\$37,500	\$20,000
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The above appropriations to the board of finance are for funding student-facing activities of IUSG policy departments under R.B. § 5-4. However, the board of finance shall not grant any money from these appropriations to fund an activity for which money is already appropriated by this act.

FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE PREVENTION

CAMPAIGN FOR SURVIVORS

Awareness and Marketing	\$900	\$900	\$200
Donations to Student Organizations	\$0	\$0	\$2,000

The above appropriations for awareness and marketing are for an informational and promotional campaign to support students who are survivors of sexual misconduct and educate the student body on how to support survivors.

The above appropriations for donations to student organizations are for transfers of money to one (1) or more IU self-governed student organizations whose purpose is directly related to supporting students who are survivors of sexual misconduct.

“RED ZONE” INITIATIVE

Total Expense	\$1,500	\$500	\$0
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The above appropriations are for an informational campaign during the 2022 fall semester for the purposes of educating students about consent in sexual contexts and of lowering rates of sexual assault on campus. This money may be used for flyers, posters, information cards, and related materials.

FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

DONATIONS TO CULTURAL CENTERS

Total Transfers	\$0	\$6,000	\$6,000
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No later than May 31, 2023, the director of diversity, equity, and inclusion shall spend the above appropriations as a direct transfer of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to each of the African American Arts Institute, the Asian Culture Center, the First Nations Educational and Cultural Center, the LGBTQ+ Culture Center, La Casa Culture Center, and Neal Marshall Black Culture Center. As soon as a transfer is made under this

paragraph, the director shall request a written report from the cultural center to which the transfer was made on how the donated money was used or is intended to be used. As soon as the director receives such a report, the director shall deliver the report to congress and the president.

FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF STUDENT LIFE

SAFER SEX EXPRESS

Total Transfers	\$1,000	\$2,000	\$2,000
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The director of student life shall spend the above appropriations for safer sex express as direct transfers to the Student Health Center for the purpose of funding the safer sex express program of the Student Health Center. The transfers shall be made on the following schedule:

Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) no later than October 1, 2022; and

The other two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) no later than February 1, 2023.

SECTION 6. R.B. § 1-3-5, AS ADDED BY IUSG.21-22-19, SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]: Sec. 5. (a) This section applies to all:

- (1) bills; and
- (2) proclamations;

that take effect before the date described in section 3 of this article.

(b) No later than five (5) days after the enactment of a legislative measure to which this section applies, the recorder of congress or such other congressional officer as congress may designate shall deliver a paper or electronic copy of the legislative measure to each of the following:

- (1) the department of records;
- (2) the clerk of the supreme court;
- (3) the clerk of any and every other IUSG court; and
- (4) if the measure contains an appropriation, the ~~office~~ **department** of the treasury.

SECTION 7. R.B. § 5-1-9 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]. ~~Sec. 9. (a) The environmental affairs fund is established within the IU account for the purpose of holding money for department of external relations budgets.~~

~~(b) The fund consists of appropriations to the fund.~~

SECTION 8. R.B. § 5-1-10 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]. ~~Sec. 10. (a) This section applies after May 31, 2022.~~

~~(b) The environmental affairs reserve sub-account is established within the environmental affairs fund for the purpose of disbursing money for the activities of the department.~~

~~(c) Except as otherwise provided in the IUSG Bylaws or other statute, no money shall be drawn from the sub-account.~~

SECTION 9. R.B. § 5-2-7 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]. ~~Sec. 7. (a) The sexual violence prevention fund is established within the IU account for the purpose of holding money for department of sexual violence prevention budgets.~~

~~(b) The fund consists of appropriations to the fund.~~

SECTION 10. R.B. § 5-3-2, AS ADDED BY IUSG.21-22-16, SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]: Sec. 2. The board of finance is

established within the ~~office~~ **department** of the treasury. The purpose of the board is to distribute money for student-facing activities of IUSG policy departments.

SECTION 11. R.B. § 5-4-8, AS ADDED BY IUSG.21-22-16, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2022]: Sec. 8. (a) When the board issues a funding approval under this article, the amount of money specified in the approval pursuant to section 6(1) of this article shall be considered to be transferred from the appropriations available to the board for use under this article to the appropriations available to the department whose director submitted the request. Upon the approval of the funding, that money ceases to be available to the board and becomes available to the department for expenditure or encumbrance.

(b) When a transfer occurs under this section, the ~~office~~ **department** of the treasury shall ensure that the books and financial reports of the ~~office~~ **department** reflect the transfer.
